Both Christian County Cemetery Records and Combined Service Records list his death date as 23 December 1861.

Texas Confederate Soldiers, 1861-1865 Unit Rosters, confirm this soldier's name and rank.

He was enlisted by Captain R. S. Camp at age 20 years at Gilmer, Texas on 27 September 1861.

Private J.A. Youngblood was from Upshur County, Texas.

He was mustered into service on 2 October 1861 at Marshall, Texas.

Private John H. Finley and Lieutenant O.J. Womack died here in Hopkinsville, but we believe their remains were sent by train back to Marshall, Texas, where we assume their graves were marked with headstones.

Of the 303 Confederates that we know were buried here, some we have yet to find a company or a Regiment to which they belonged. There are as follows:
